Glocalization in a Seemingly Globalized World: Late Antiquity beyond the Borders of the Roman World

The theoretical concept of 'glocalization', or the refraction of a global phenomenon through local entities, has received increasing attention in Roman archaeology over the last years. This framework has been used by researchers as an analytical tool to further understand how global transformations (i.e. material, symbolic and visual) happened differently in discrete regions within the Roman world. Due to the popularity of glocalization among both sociological and archaeological theoretical studies, this seminar aims to reflect on its application to the decoration of domestic spaces in Roman provinces and the agency of individuals. Through different case studies, the standing of this theoretical framework for the study of Roman provincial art will be debated.
